**PATIENCE:** 1 The suffering of afflictions, pain, toil, calamity, provocation or other evil, with a calm, unruffled temper; endurance without murmuring or fretfulness. 2 A calm temper which bears evils without murmuring or discontent. 3 The act or quality of waiting long for justice or expected good without discontent. 4 Perseverance; constancy in labor or exertion. 5 The quality of bearing offenses and injuries without anger or revenge.

**PATIENT:** 1 Having the quality of enduring evils without murmuring or fretfulness; sustaining afflictions of body or mind with fortitude, calmness or christian submission to the divine will. 2 Not easily provoked; calm under the sufferance of injuries or offenses; not revengeful. 3 Persevering; constant in pursuit or exertion; calmly diligent. 4 Not hasty; not over eager or impetuous; waiting or expecting with calmness or without discontent.
